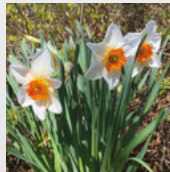

Daffodil bulbs contain the poison lycorine. The poison protects them from animal predators making it a good plant for areas where deer and rodents are known to be a problem in the garden.
