## **Open Discussion**

- Truitt expressed support for the growth that educational programming has seen from 2022-2025. She also suggested a 4-6 part adult educational programming series. Felger pointed out that there may be some over-saturation in the adult nature education offerings with OSU extension offering programming as well. The idea was discussed of running something in connection with Winter Talks to encourage adults to sign up for the entire series of lectures which begin in January.
- Palma suggested some topics for consideration for Winter Talks might include deer management and feral cats. She also suggested that our Community Outreach be focused more on schools with Traveling Naturalist heading out to classrooms.

- James suggested that a program on Hike and Bike Trail Etiquette might be beneficial, though that might be more of a Recreation Department endeavor. He also inquired whether or not the Education Department could solicit funding for events in the form of businesses underwriting the events.
- Peachock inquired about surveys that might be implemented at events and programs as a means for gathering feedback for improvement. She also asked if the paranormal programming could be increased to throughout the year—something we actually have begun doing monthly throughout the year. She suggested incorporating some Drama and Storytelling components to our events/programming.
- Felger stressed the importance of educators attending professional development courses such as ECO. Additionally, he inquired about the possibility of MCMP Education Department collaborating with Mahoning Valley Historical Society on some future paranormal programming.
- Felger inquired if we provide a discounted fee for field trips for Mahoning County schools (we do) and mentioned the availability of grants available for assistance (ODNR Education Grant and Ohio Environmental Fund Grant)
