All applicable pages of the Proposal, Section 3 must be fully completed in ink or typed, removed from this book and submitted in duplicate. Bidders should retain the remainder of the Contract Documents for their records. A copy of the Proposal will be returned to the successful bidder.

Please double check your bid before submission. Errors or omissions could result in your bid being declared informal or irregular and possibly rejected.

The intent of the contract is to provide for the construction and completion in every detail of the work described. The Contractor shall perform all items of work covered and stipulated in the Contract Documents and perform altered and extra work, furnish all labor, materials, equipment, tools, transportation and supplies required to complete the work in accordance with the Contract Documents and terms of the contract. Should any misunderstanding arise as to the intent or meaning of the plans, specifications, special provisions or Proposal, or any discrepancy appear, the decision of the Project Manager shall be final and conclusive.

Legal Notice to Contractors

Sealed proposals to furnish all labor, materials and equipment for:

2020 PARKING LOT IMPROVEMENTS

will be received by the Board of Park Commissioners of the Mill Creek Metropolitan Park District at the Park District Office, 7574 Columbiana-Canfield Road, Canfield, Ohio, 44406, until 1:00 PM (Youngstown time) on Friday, March 27, 2020, and will be publicly opened and immediately read aloud, tabulated and reported to the Board of Park Commissioners.

The contract documents will be available at the Park District Office, 7574 Columbiana-Canfield Road, Canfield, Ohio, where responsible contractors may obtain same upon deposit of \$25.00 which deposit will not be returned. All contractors who intend to submit a bid must obtain the contract documents from the Park District Office and register as a bidder on the official sign-in sheet.

Each proposal must be accompanied by a bid bond for 100% of the proposal, or a certified check, cashiers check or letter of credit in the amount of 10% of the proposal. The check shall be drawn on a solvent bank and made payable to the Board of Park Commissioners, Mill Creek Metropolitan Park District and any letter of credit submitted shall be revocable only at the option of the Board of Park Commissioners, Mill Creek Metropolitan Park District, as a condition that if the proposal is accepted, a contract in the amount of 100% of the amount bid in accordance with plans and specifications is entered into. All bonds provided must be obtained from a surety licensed by, or a surplus lines company approved by, the State Superintendent of Insurance.

All proposals submitted shall be good for a period of sixty (60) days after the date of bid opening. Notice of claim of right to withdraw a proposal must be made in writing and filed with the Park District within two business days after conclusion of the bid opening procedure in accordance with the provisions of Section 9.31 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Attention of the bidders is particularly directed to the requirements and condition of construction and to the minimum wage rates to be paid under this contract. Successful bidders will be required to pay at least minimum wage rates predetermined by the Ohio Revised Code, Chapter 4115 or United States Department of Labor, Wage and Hour Division. The schedule of approved wage rates is incorporated into the contract documents.

The Board of Park Commissioners of the Mill Creek Metropolitan Park District reserves the right to reject any, or part of any, or all, proposals; to waive any technicalities or informalities in bidding and to accept any proposal deemed most favorable to the Board of Park Commissioners, or to advertise for new proposals.

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. Qualification of Bidders

All Contractors bidding this project shall be actively engaged and experienced in work of the nature described in the Contract Documents. All bidders shall submit with their bid the Qualifications Questionnaire in Section 3 and shall list no less than three references for which work of a similar nature has been completed. Additional qualifications may be required as specified in Section 6 and/or in Section 8 of these Contract Documents.

2. Inquiries and Agenda

Should the bidder find any discrepancies in, or omissions from, the Plans and Specifications, or should there be any doubt, as to the meaning or interpretations, he should at once notify the Park District who will send out written instructions to all bidders. The Park District will not be responsible for any oral instructions.

The Park District shall receive inquiries on their Plans and Specifications up to four (4) days prior to the bid due date. All Addenda and the Form of Proposal will be available at the Park District Office to be distributed to the bidders no later than two (2) days prior to the bid due date. All bidders are required to examine carefully the Plans and Specifications and to submit any and all inquiries for the Park District's consideration within the time period mentioned above.

3. Conditions of Work

- a. Bidders shall, by personal inspection, inform themselves of the conditions under which the work is to be performed, inspect the site of the work, and determine the obstacles which may be encountered and all other relevant matters concerning the work to be performed, including the availability of materials and equipment, and no contractor shall be allowed any extra compensation for items on which he has failed to so inform himself prior to the bidding.
- b. The bidder is expected to base his bid on materials and equipment complying fully with the Contract Documents, and, in the event he names in his bid, materials and equipment which do not conform, he will be responsible for furnishing materials which fully conform at no change in his bid price.
- c. The submission of a bid will be construed by the Park District to mean that the bidder has made such examination and agrees to fulfill all requirements of the Contract in full accordance with the Contract Documents, and that he is entirely familiar with and thoroughly understands all such requirements.

4. Contract Documents

The Contract Documents shall consist of the Legal Advertisement, General Terms and Conditions, Proposal, Agreement, Prevailing Wage Rates, Construction Notes, Completion Affidavit, Construction Drawings, Specifications, ODOT LPA Bid Template, all Addenda issued, all required bonds and policies of insurance, and any miscellaneous attachments.

The Park District shall furnish the Contractor with two (2) copies of the Contract Documents and two copies of the Construction Drawings at the preconstruction meeting. The Contractor shall keep one set of each available on the project site at all times.

The Contract Documents listed above and any supplemental specifications or supplementary documents are essential parts of the contracts and a requirement occurring in one is as binding as though occurring in all. They are intended to be complementary and to describe and provide for a complete work. In case of discrepancy, calculated dimensions will govern over scaled

dimensions, plans will govern over specifications. In all other cases, where there is a conflict in the requirements of the work or the scope for an item of construction, the decision of the Project Manager will be considered final and conclusive.

The Contractor shall take no advantage of any apparent error or omission in the Contract Documents. In the event the Contractor discovers such an error or omission, he shall immediately notify the Project Manager. The Project Manager will then make such corrections and interpretation as may be deemed necessary for fulfilling the intent of the plans and specifications.

5. Project Manager

The Park District shall establish a Project Manager for this project, to be named at the preconstruction meeting. The Project Manager shall be responsible for the administration and satisfactory completion of the project. The Project Manager has the authority to reject defective material and suspend any work being improperly performed. Any extra work or changes in work ordered by the Park District will be accomplished through the Project Manager. All communications with the Park District should be through the Project Manager.

The foregoing does not make the Project Manager responsible for the Contractor in the construction process, but does make the Project Manager responsible for examining the work as it progresses and to notify the Park District and the Contractor whenever construction is not in conformance with the Contract Documents. The Project Manager is not responsible for construction means, methods, sequences, procedures, or for safety precautions and programs in connection with the work and he shall not be responsible for the Contractor's failure to carry out work in accordance with the Contract Documents.

6. Sales Tax

The current Sales Tax Act of Ohio specifically exempts sales tax to institutions supported by public funds. However, the Contractor is expected to pay all sales taxes which may be lawfully assessed against him in connection with his purchase of materials to be incorporated in the work under his proposal.

7. Bid Security

Each proposal must be accompanied by a bid bond for the full amount of the proposal, or a certified check, cashier's check or letter of credit in the amount of 10% of the proposal. The check shall be drawn on a solvent bank and made payable to the Board of Park Commissioners, Mill Creek Metropolitan Park District and any letter of credit submitted shall be revocable only at the option of the Board of Park Commissioners, Mill Creek Metropolitan Park District, as a condition that if the proposal is accepted, the bidder will enter into a proper contract in accordance with the Contract Documents.

All bonds provided must be obtained from a surety licensed by, or a surplus lines company approved by, the State Superintendent of Insurance.

Bid security conditions and form are subject to Sections 153.54 and 153.571 of the Ohio Revised Code.

8. Preparation of Proposals

Bids shall be submitted on the accompanying Proposal Forms furnished by the Park District. Any alterations, additions or erasures to said form shall be considered as irregular and grounds for rejection of said bid. All applicable pages of Section 3, Proposal, of the Contract Documents must be completed fully in ink or typed and removed from this book and submitted in duplicate. Bidders may retain the remainder of the Contract Documents for their records. The Proposal must be so filled out as to make the bid complete and free from ambiguity as to its meaning.

Proposal forms shall be signed by the bidder, in ink, giving business address. In case of firms or corporations, the Proposal forms must be signed by an authorized officer or agent. When a Proposal form is submitted by a partnership the personal signature of one of the partners, in addition to the name of the firm, must be included.

Bidder hereby agrees that the Contract Documents and work performed in accordance therewith will be governed by the laws of the State of Ohio, and bidder expressly agrees to be subject to jurisdiction in the State of Ohio in the event of litigation.

9. Interpretation of Quantities in Proposal

The quantities listed in the proposal are approximate and are given so that a uniform basis exists for comparison of bids. Payment to the Contractor will be made only for actual quantities of work performed and accepted or materials furnished and accepted in accordance with the contract except for lump sum contracts, and except for lump sum items in unit price contracts. The scheduled quantities of work to be accomplished and materials to be furnished may each be increased, decreased or omitted as hereinafter provided. The term "lump sum" when used as an item of payment will mean complete payment for the work described in the item. When a complete structure or structure unit ("lump sum" work) is specified as the unit of measurement, the unit will be construed to include all necessary fittings and accessories. No payment shall be made for any unauthorized work or work not meeting specifications. The Project Manager will have authority at his sole discretion to make deductions, including deductions in lump sum prices, for work not meeting specifications in lieu of ordering the removal and replacement of the item of construction.

10. Withdrawal of Proposals

All proposals submitted shall be valid for a period of sixty (60) days after the date of bid opening. Notices of a claim of right to withdraw a proposal prior to the expiration of the sixty (60) day period must be made in writing and filed with the Executive Director of the Park District within two (2) business days after conclusion of the bid opening procedure. The Board of Park Commissioners will consider the withdrawal claim only if the following conditions apply:

- a. The proposal price is substantially lower than the other bids.
- b. The bid was submitted in good faith.
- c. The reason for the price bid being substantially lower was a clerical mistake as opposed to a judgment mistake.
- d. The mistake was due to an unintentional and substantial arithmetic error or unintentional omission.

It is the obligation of the bidder to substantiate his withdrawal claim by providing all necessary documentation and forms with his claim. The claim and substantiating documentation may be sent to the Park District by FAX, to (330) 702-3010. The decision of the Board of Park Commissioners will be final and binding.

No proposal may be withdrawn under this section when the result would be the awarding of another proposal of the same bidder.

If a proposal is withdrawn under authority of this section, the Board of Park Commissioners may award the bid to the next lowest bidder or reject all bids and re-advertise for bidding. In the event the Board of Park Commissioners re-advertises for bidding, the withdrawing bidder shall pay the costs in connection with the resubmission, of printing new bidding documents, required advertising, and printing and mailing notices to prospective bidders.

In the event the Board of Park Commissioners denies the claim for withdrawal and the bidder refuses to perform, the Park District may reject all bids or award to the next lowest bidder and the original bidder forfeits his bid security.

A bidder may withdraw his proposal prior to the time set for opening bids by submitting a written request to the Park District Business Office. This request must be in the possession of the Park District Business Office prior to the opening date and time, to be considered: Upon timely receipt of such request, the bid will be returned, unopened, to the bidder.

11. Consideration of Proposals

After proposals are opened and read, they will be tabulated and compared on the basis of the summation of the products of the quantities shown in the Proposal by the unit bid prices. In the event of a discrepancy between unit bid prices and extensions thereof, the unit bid price shall govern.

Lump Sum contracts will be compared on the basis of lump sum prices bid.

In the event the same total price for the work is submitted by more than one bidder, the Board of Park Commissioners will select a successful bidder in their sole discretion.

Proposals will also be compared on the basis of conformity with the specifications for the work bid, previous performance of the bidder and any other factor that has a direct influence upon the ability of the bidder to provide the work bid or the ability of the bidder to meet specifications.

The Board of Park Commissioners reserves the right to reject any, part of any, or all bids; to waive any technicalities and informalities in bidding and to accept any bid deemed most favorable to the Park District or to advertise for new proposals.

12. Disqualification of Bidders and Proposals

The Park District reserves the right to disqualify a proposal or bidder or refuse to consider a proposal for any of the following reasons:

- a. If the proposal is on a form other than the Proposal form furnished by the Park District, or, if the Proposal is altered or any part thereof detached, or not completed.
- b. If there are unauthorized additions, conditional or alternate proposals, or irregularities of any kind which may tend to make the proposal incomplete, indefinite, or ambiguous as to its meaning.
- c. If the proposal does not contain a unit price for each item listed except in the case of authorized alternate pay items or lump sum items.
- d. If the bidder adds any provisions reserving the right to accept or reject an award, or to enter into a contract pursuant to an award.
- e. Lack of competency of the bidder to provide the work bid.
- f. Default or failure to perform faithfully or adequately under previous contracts awarded.
- g. Lack of cooperation under previous contracts awarded.
- h. More than one proposal for the same work from an individual, firm or corporation under the same or different names.
- i. Evidence of collusion among bidders. Participants in such collusion will receive no recognition as bidders for any future work of the Park District until such participants have satisfactorily answered and resolved all questions and stipulations of the Board of Park Commissioners. Nothing in this section shall prevent the Board of Park Commissioners from permanently barring any participants in collusion from bidding on Park District work.
- j. Bid prices which are obviously unbalanced.

13. Disposition of Proposal Guarantee

All bid bonds except those made by the two lowest qualified bidders shall be returned to the person making the bid as soon as the lowest qualified bidders are selected, but in any event after sixty (60) days of the opening of the bids has expired. If the bidder to whom the award is made shall execute the contract and furnish the required bond or security for the performance of the contract within ten (10) days of the award, all bid bonds shall be returned.

In case the bidder to whom such award is made shall fail to execute and secure a contract within ten (10) days the award shall be vacated and the deposit forfeited as liquidated damages, and the contract may be awarded to the next lowest qualified bidder who shall thereupon execute the contract and furnish the required bond or security for the performance of the contract within ten (10) days or forfeit his deposit as liquidated damages.

14. Bidders Affidavit

All bidders are required to duly execute and submit the Bidder's Affidavit located in Section 3, Proposal, of the Contract Documents, which states that all declarations and statements made in the bid are true to the best of his knowledge and belief.

15. Non-Collusion Affidavit

All bidders are required to duly execute and submit the Non-Collusion Affidavit located in Section 3, Proposal, of the Contract Documents.

16. Competency of Bidders

The Board of Park Commissioners may make such investigations as it deems necessary to determine the ability and competency of the bidder to perform the work. Upon request, the bidder shall furnish evidence satisfactory to the Board that he has the necessary resources and experience to meet the conditions of the contract and specifications.

The Board reserves the right to reject any proposal received if the investigation fails to satisfy the Board that such bidder is properly qualified or has the ability to carry out the obligations of the contract and to complete the work as specified.

17. Information to be Furnished

In considering proposals for this work, particular attention will be given to the method of construction which the bidder plans to follow; the available experienced and skilled men which he plans to use in the performance of the work; the types of equipment and materials he plans to install, together with samples, which may be subjected to tests to determine their quality and fitness for work; and he shall prepare and furnish this information in writing at the Park District's request.

Furthermore, the bidder must, prior to the award of the contract, be prepared to discuss in detail, all matters relating to any special features of the work, with the goal that the Park District may obtain high grade workmanship and proper performance of the Contract.

18. Employees of Contractors and Subcontractors

It is agreed and understood that the Contractor and any subcontractor shall be and is an independent contractor, the Park District being interested only in the results obtained; and having the general right of inspection and supervision in order to secure the satisfactory completion of the work. Under no circumstances shall an employee of the Contractor or any subcontractor be deemed an employee of the Park District; neither shall the Contractor or any subcontractor act as an agent or employee of the Park District.

Any person, who is on Contractor's or subcontractor's payroll and receives, has received or is entitled to receive payment from Contractor or subcontractor in connection with any work performed or to be performed hereunder shall be the employee of Contractor or subcontractor even though the Park District reimburses Contractor for the amount paid such employee.

Contractor and any subcontractor shall furnish at its own expense and risk all labor, material, equipment, tools, transportation and other items necessary in the performance of the work or

services covered hereby, except such of said items as the Park District specifically agrees in writing to furnish.

19. Subcontractors

All bidders are required to fill out and submit the List of Subcontractors form located in Section 3, Proposal, of the Contract Documents, which lists all subcontractors they intend to employ on the work under this Contract. Failure to include such a list will be construed as indicating that the bidder will do all work required with his own forces. The Park District specifically reserves the right to approve all subcontractors.

The Contractor shall submit a final list of subcontractors at the preconstruction meeting. The employment of any subcontractor not indicated on the list submitted at the preconstruction meeting will not be allowed except with special permission of the Park District.

Any subcontract for work covered by this contract must conform to the requirements of the contract as a whole. The Contractor shall be solely responsible to the Park District for the acts or faults of his subcontractor(s) and of such subcontractor's officers, agents and employees, each of whom shall be deemed to be the agent or employee of the Contractor to the extent of his subcontract.

20. Basis of Award

The award of the contract or any portion of the contract will be made to the lowest, most responsive, responsible and best qualified bidder, as the applicable law may provide, who meets the requirements of the Contract Documents. If alternate bids or items of construction are solicited, the award will be based on bids submitted for the base amount plus any combination of alternates which are selected by the Board of Park Commissioners.

21. Cancellation of Award

The Park District reserves the right to rescind the award of any contract at any time before the execution of a contract by all parties without any liability against the Park District.

22. Execution of Agreement

The bidder to whom the contract is awarded will be required to execute a written agreement with approved sureties within ten (10) days from the date of the service of the notice to that effect. In case he shall fail to do so, the bid deposit accompanying his proposal shall thereupon be forfeited to and the amount thereof retained by the Park District as liquidated damages for any expense or delay which may be incurred in making another letting for the performance of said work, and to indemnify said Park District for any loss which it may sustain by failure of the bidder to execute the contract and furnish bond as aforesaid and the work may be re-advertised or awarded to the next lowest or next best bidder, as the Park District may determine.

23. Performance/Payment Bond

The successful bidder is required to furnish both a performance bond and a payment bond in a sum not less than one hundred percent (100%) of the total price bid for the completed work. The bonds must be those of an approved surety company authorized to transact business within the State of Ohio. Bonding conditions and form are subject to Section 153.57 of the Ohio Revised Code. The Mill Creek Metropolitan Park District (and additional agencies as specified in Section 6 of these Contract Document) shall be named as an obligee on the bonds.

If, any time after execution and approval of this contract and receipt of the bonds required by the Contract Documents, the Park District shall deem any of the sureties upon such bonds to be unsatisfactory, or if, for any reason, such bonds shall cease to be adequate security for the Mill Creek Metropolitan Park District, the Contractor shall, within ten (10) days after written notice of

the Park District to do so, furnish new or additional bonds in form, sum and signed by such sureties as shall be satisfactory to the Park District. No further payment shall be deemed due nor shall any further payment be made to the Contractor unless and until such new or additional bonds shall be furnished and approved. The premium on such bonds shall be paid by the Contractor. The bond will not be released until all of the provisions of the contract have been fulfilled.

24. Liquidated Damages for Failure to Enter into Contract

The successful bidder, upon his failure or refusal to execute and deliver the contract and bonds required within ten (10) days after he has received notice of the acceptance of his bid, shall forfeit to the Park District, as liquidated damages for such failure or refusal, the security deposit with his bid.

25. Progress Schedule

At the preconstruction meeting, the Contractor shall submit a proposed construction progress schedule of operation, showing clearly how he proposes to conduct the work as to bring about the completion of his work within the time limit specified. This progress schedule shall outline the proposed sequence of operations, the rates of progress and the dates when his work will be sufficiently advanced to permit the installation of the work under other contracts. The work under this contract shall be so scheduled that as structures are completed they can be placed into useful operation with a minimum of delay. The progress schedule shall be subject to the approval of the Project Manager.

Should the actual rate of progress fall behind the scheduled rate of progress, and unless delay is authorized, the Contractor shall furnish additional labor, work, overtime, or take any other additional steps required for completion of the project on the scheduled completion date as set forth in the contract. No additional compensation beyond the set contract price shall be paid for additional expenses incurred in maintaining the progress schedule.

26. Preconstruction Meeting

Before work commences, a preconstruction meeting will be held with the Contractor, subcontractors, the Project Manager, and Park District officials.

27. Notice to Proceed

Bidder must agree to commence work on or before a date to be specified in a written "Notice to Proceed" issued by the Park District and to fully complete the project within the time limit specified in the Proposal.

28. Date for Completion

The Contractor shall have completed the work under this contract within the calendar days stated in the Proposal. If the contract is revised in any material respect and said revision will cause delay in the completion of the work, the Park District will postpone the completion date by the number of calendar days determined by the Project Manager. It is the intent of the Board to prevent any undo delays and reduce any inconvenience to the users of Park District facilities.

If the Contractor finds it impossible for reasons beyond his control to complete the work by the time specified or as extended, he may, at any time prior to the expiration of the contract time, make a written request to the Project Manager for an extension of time setting forth the reasons which he believes will justify the granting of his request. The Contractor's plea that insufficient time was specified is not a valid reason for extension of time. The Park District will not grant any extensions of time where the Contractor or subcontractor has not prosecuted the work faithfully and in a timely manner without delays or breaks in the work. Extensions will not be granted

where the Contractor or subcontractor did not order the materials and equipment needed to complete the contract in a timely manner. The Contractor is responsible for insuring that any subcontractor orders any material or equipment needed on time. The Project Manager will make the final decision as to whether to grant an extension of time up to seven (7) days. The Executive Director will make the final decision as to whether to grant an extension of time from 8 to 30 days. Any requests for extension of time over thirty (30) days will be forwarded to the Board of Park Commissioners for a final decision.

29. Completion Affidavit

Before the final estimate is approved and paid, the Contractor is required to complete and submit the Completion Affidavit found in Section 7 of the Contract Documents, and to submit completed Subcontractor Completion Affidavits for each and every subcontractor that performed work on the project. Failure to submit such an affidavit will result in the amount due the subcontractor being withheld until such an affidavit is submitted.

30. Failure to Complete on Time

For each calendar day that any work shall remain uncompleted after the contract completion date, the sum specified herein will be deducted from any money due the Contractor, not as a penalty but as liquidated damages plus all costs for the Project Manager incurred as a result of failure to complete on time. If the liquidated damages incurred exceed the money due, the Contractor shall be liable for the payment of the difference to the Park District.

The Park District may waive such portions of the liquidated damages as may accrue after the work is in condition for safe and convenient use by the traveling public.

31. Storage of Materials and Equipment

The Contractor shall make all necessary arrangements and provisions for the storage of materials and equipment to be used on this contract. All material stockpile and equipment storage locations shall be as approved by the Project Manager. Prior to final acceptance, stockpile and storage locations shall be restored at the Contractor's expense to conditions that existed prior to the work.

Products and material shall be stored and protected in accordance with manufacturer's instructions, with weather tight seals and labels intact and legible. For exterior storage of fabricated products, place on sloped supports above the ground, by methods which will prevent

soiling, disfigurement, or damage. Products subject to deterioration shall be covered with an impervious sheet covering with an allowance for ventilation to avoid condensation. Loose granular materials shall be stored on solid flat surfaces in a well-drained area to prevent mixing with foreign matter.

Contractors may provide and maintain storage trailers on the project site for their use. The location of the storage trailers on the project site shall be subject to the approval of the Project Manager.

32. Sanitary Provisions

The Contractor shall provide and maintain in a neat and sanitary condition, such accommodations for the use of his employees as may be necessary to comply with the sanitary requirements of the law. The location of temporary, portable sanitary facilities on the project site shall be subject to the approval of the Project Manager. The Contractor shall properly maintain such facilities and shall be responsible for clean-up and repairs due to vandalism. The Contractor may use public Park District facilities, if these facilities are open, usable and near the project site.

33. Project Signs, Field Office

No signs or advertisements of any type shall be erected or displayed on the project site during or after construction of the project, except those required by law and those erected by the Park District.

Unless specifically noted in the Construction Notes, a field office is not required. The Contractor may provide and maintain a field office on the project site for their use. The location of the field office on the project site shall be subject to the approval of the Project Manager.

34. Temporary Traffic Control Devices

Temporary traffic control devices shall be furnished, erected and maintained by the Contractor for the proper and safe conduct of the work. All traffic control devices must be approved by the Project Manager before erection. Traffic control devices shall be maintained until the project is officially completed and/or safe for public use, as determined by the Park District. The provisions of this section shall not in any way relieve the Contractor of any of his legal responsibilities or liabilities for the safety of the public.

The Contractor shall furnish, erect and maintain 'work specific' barriers to prevent unauthorized entry to construction areas and to protect existing adjacent facilities and properties from damage during construction operations.

35. Insurance

Before commencing the work, the Contractor will produce evidence, satisfactory to the Park District, that it is in current compliance with the Workmen's Compensation Law of Ohio and that it has Comprehensive General Liability Insurance coverage while engaged in said work with limits of not less than ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence for damage to property and not less than TWO MILLION DOLLARS (2,000,000.00) per occurrence for injury to or death of a person or persons. If automotive vehicles are used by Contractors, or subcontractors, Public Liability of \$1,000,000/\$1,000,000 limits as to bodily injury, and \$500,000 limits as to property damage will be required.

Certificates of Insurance coverage submitted to the Park District by the Contractor must carry the provision that the policy will not be terminated without ten (10) days' notice to the Park District. In the event of special hazards such as explosion, collapse or underground hazards under this contract, the Insurance certificate must show coverage extended for such operations.

The Mill Creek Metropolitan Park District must be named as an additional insured on all certificates of insurance coverage.

The Contractor will require of any respective subcontractor that similar evidence of subcontractor's insurance be submitted to him before said Contractor's work be commenced and a copy given to the Park District.

Nothing contained above shall release the Contractor, or any subcontractor, from their responsibility to protect themselves against loss by any other peril than those referred above, and no claims for extra money by the Contractor for any such loss or damage shall be recognized by the owner.

Loss, if any, is to be paid to the Park District, and the Contractor or Contractors, in proportion as their interests may appear as stipulated in the contract for recovery damage.

36. Protection of Work

The Contractor shall continuously maintain adequate protection of all his work and shall protect the Park District's property from damage and injury arising in connection with his contract. Newly poured concrete shall be protected and adequately monitored throughout the curing process to prevent any graffiti or other undesirable marks. Any cost for repair or replacement caused by defective, unprotected, or ill-timed work shall be borne by the Contractor responsible thereof.

37. Alteration of Plans or Character of Work

The Park District, without invalidating the Contract, may order extra work or make changes by altering, adding to, or deducting from the work, the contract sum being adjusted accordingly.

In giving instructions, the Park District shall have authority to make minor changes in the work, not involving extra cost, but otherwise, except in an emergency endangering life or property, no extra work or change in the contract shall be made unless in pursuance of a written order from the Park District, and no claim for an addition to the contract sum shall be valid unless so ordered.

Such extra work shall be performed in accordance with the specifications and so directed by the Project Manager. The work will be paid for at the unit prices or lump sum prices stipulated in the order authorizing the work. Unless such alterations and increases or decreases materially change the character of the work to be performed or the cost thereof, the altered work shall be paid for at the same unit prices as other parts of the work.

Should the Contractor encounter or the Park District discover during the progress of the work subsurface or latent physical conditions at the site differing materially from those indicated in the contract, or unknown physical conditions at the site of an unusual nature, differing materially from those ordinarily encountered and generally recognized as inherent in work of the character provided for in the contract, the Park District shall be promptly notified in writing of such conditions before they are disturbed. The Park District will thereupon promptly investigate the conditions and if found they do so materially differ and cause an increase or decrease in the cost of, or the time required for performance of, the contract, an equitable adjustment will be made.

38. Owner's Right to do Work

If the Contractor shall neglect to accomplish the work properly or fail to perform any provision of this Contract, the Park District after three (3) days written notice to the Contractor, may, without prejudice to any other remedy he may have, make good such deficiencies and may deduct the cost thereof from the contract sum. In addition, the Park District may, at any time, decide to

complete portions of the work with his own forces and may do so after three (3) days written notice to the Contractor and may deduct the cost thereof from the contract sum.

39. Or Equal Clause/Substitution

Whenever, in any of the Contract Documents, an article, material, or equipment is defined by describing a proprietary product, or by using the name of a manufacturer or vendor, the term "or certified equal", if not inserted, shall be implied. The specific article, material, or equipment mentioned shall be understood as indicating the type, function, minimum standard of design, efficiency, and quality desired, and shall not be construed in such a manner as to exclude manufacturer's products of comparable quality, design, strength, and efficiency, approved by the Park District on the basis of product specification and field performance record.

If an article, material, equipment or form of construction is bid as a substitution to be considered as an equal, it shall be specifically noted when the bid proposal is submitted. Complete specifications, samples, descriptions and support documentation shall be furnished to the Park District at the time of bid submittal for all substitutions. If deemed necessary by the Park District, the material or product will be submitted to an independent testing laboratory to verify that the product equals or surpasses the specifications. All costs for testing the material or product shall be paid by the Contractor. If the bidder does not specifically note a substitution, then all articles, materials, products, equipment and form of construction to be supplied and carried out shall be as specified in the Contract Documents.

40. Progress Meetings

Special meetings with the Contractor and such subcontractors as may be requested, shall be set up by the Project Manager as often as deemed necessary, to follow up the sequence of operations, expedite the job, secure cooperation of all parties, etc.

41. Permits, Fees, Compliance with Laws

The Contractor shall obtain and pay for all permits, notices, licenses, certificates of inspection, tests, royalties and fees that may be required for the work.

The Contractor shall comply with all laws, codes, ordinances, and regulations bearing on the conduct of the work.

The publications listed below form a part of this specification to the extent referenced:

- a. Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Hazard Communication Standard (29CFR Part 1910.1200):
The Contractor shall provide for the well-being of the their employees and park visitors by adhering to the requirements of the Hazard Communication Standard and other applicable city, state, and federal safety requirements. The Contractor shall submit Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) to the Park District prior to delivery of hazardous materials to the site. Products of a hazardous nature will not be accepted on the work site without a MSDS on file. These products shall be in containers that have clearly legible manufacturer's labels that include the appropriate hazard warnings and list the name and address of the manufacturer. These products shall not be stored on site unless fully secured and approved by the Park District.
- b. Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), OSHA General Industry Safety and Health Standards (29 CFR 1910)
- c. Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), OSHA Construction Industry Standards (29 CFR 1926)
- d. Refer to OSHA Publications 2206 & 2207, for sale by the Superintendent of Documents, U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, DC 20402

- e. Code of Federal Regulation (CFR), National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (40 CFR, Part 61)

42. Laying out Work

The Contractor shall locate, protect and use any existing benchmarks as shown on the plans. Benchmarks disturbed by the Contractor shall be properly reset and documented, and all information submitted to the Project Manager.

As directed by the Project Manager, the Contractor shall establish temporary benchmarks, easily accessible during the progress of the work, to determine all lines and grades and to verify same from time to time during the progress of the work. The Contractor shall keep on the job at all times, a transit level in good working condition, and allow the Project Manager unrestricted use of same at all times.

Before ordering any material or doing any work, each contractor shall verify all measurements and grades at the site and shall be responsible for the correctness of same. Any difference which may be found between the actual lines and levels and the lines and levels as indicated on the drawings shall be submitted to the Project Manager for his consideration before proceeding with the work.

43. Utilities

The Contractor shall locate all underground and aboveground utility lines that are within the limits of the project, prior to beginning the work. Locations of utility lines shown on the plans may not be accurate, and additional lines may be present. The Contractor shall protect, provide support for and maintain such utility lines, and if damaged, shall immediately contact the appropriate utility company and make any necessary repairs at Contractor's expense.

The Contractor shall provide, maintain and pay for temporary light and power as required for all construction operations by extending temporary service to the project area, or by providing portable generators.

The Contractor shall provide all the water needed for construction. The use of Park District hose bibs or other sources is not permitted. The Contractor may use public drinking fountains and faucets for drinking water only. Water shall not be taken from fire hydrants without a proper written permit, even if the hydrant is located within the park. Copies of the permit shall be furnished to the Project Manager.

44. Materials, Submittal, and Workmanship

Unless otherwise stipulated in the specifications, all workmanship, equipment, materials and articles incorporated in the work covered by this contract shall be new and of the best grade of their respective kinds for the purpose. All products and equipment shall be delivered to the project site in manufacturer's original container and packaging, with labels intact indicating manufacturer, grade, quality, and other pertinent information. If not otherwise provided, material or work called for in this contract shall be furnished and performed in accordance with established industry practices and standards. If the workmanship, equipment, materials or articles incorporated in the work do not conform to contract requirements, it may be rejected, and the Contractor shall make the appropriate replacement that conforms to the requirements of the order and of the contract, or the Project Manager may make a deduction in the payment due the Contractor. In such matters, the decision of the Project Manager will be final and binding.

Any item of work or material not specifically noted or described, but which is obviously necessary to complete the work or carry out the intent of the specifications, as interpreted by the Park District, shall be considered a part of this contract.

When required by the specifications, or as directed by the Park District, the Contractor shall furnish the Park District for approval, shop drawings, samples, product literature and data concerning the materials, products and equipment which he contemplates incorporating in the work. Submittals shall be made far enough in advance of scheduled installation to provide the necessary time required for review, approval, revision and resubmittal, and for placing orders and securing delivery in a timely manner. Allow at least five (5) working days for review by the Park District following receipt of the submittal.

Samples submitted shall be identical to the article to be provided. Whenever a choice of color or pattern is available, submit color and pattern samples to the Park District for selection. Colors will be selected from any color produced by the manufacturer unless otherwise noted to be custom made, or to be selected from a particular color grouping or range.

All bituminous mixtures must be supplied by plants approved by the Director of ODOT. Prior to delivery of bulk materials to the site (asphalt, stone, aggregate, concrete, sand, etc.), the Contractor shall submit to the Project Manager an affidavit from the supplier for each material type stating that the materials furnished comply with or exceed the Park District's and/or ODOT Construction and Material Specifications.

The Contractor shall submit shop drawings, samples, product literature and data as follows:

- a. Review and approve all items prior to submission to the Park District. Stamp and sign each submittal indicating approval. Where literature includes data not pertinent to the submittal, clearly show portions excluded.
- b. Indicate actual project construction elements in all shop drawing details. Verify all measurements and conditions at the project site. Reflect field measurements prior to submittals, if possible.
- c. Furnish sufficient copies to permit two (2) copies to be retained by the Park District.
- d. Revise and resubmit as necessary to establish compliance with the Contract Documents and all review comments.

45. Transportation and Material Handling

According to Park District regulations, trucks are not permitted on park drives. Therefore, the Contractor must properly notify the Project Manager prior to material deliveries. The Project Manager shall notify the Mill Creek MetroParks Police Department of the delivery so as to permit trucks access to the project site.

All material and equipment shall be transported to the project site on approved and legal routes. Contractor shall secure and pay for all necessary permits. Material, equipment and products shall be properly secured, transported and handled in accordance with all regulations, manufacturer's recommendations or in accordance with established industry practices and standards.

The Contractor shall inspect all deliveries to the project site to assure that the material, equipment and products comply with the requirements of the contract, that quantities are correct and that the products are not damaged.

46. Superintendence, Coordination & Cooperation by Contractor

The Contractor shall have on the project site at all times, as his agent, a competent Superintendent, satisfactory to the Park District, capable of reading and thoroughly understanding the Contract Documents, and thoroughly experienced in the type of work being performed, who shall receive instructions from the Project Manager. The Superintendent shall have full authority to execute orders or directions of the Project Manager without delay and to promptly supply such materials, equipment, tools, labor and incidentals as may be required. Such superintendence shall be furnished irrespective of the amount of work sublet. The

Superintendent shall be in charge of all construction operations regardless of who performs the work.

The Contractor shall coordinate, inspect and approve work in progress of all subcontractors to assure that the quality of work is in conformance to standards established by the Contract Documents and as generally acceptable in the construction industry. All deficiencies in the work shall be appropriately corrected prior to proceeding with additional work or later phases of the work.

The Contractor shall give the work the constant attention necessary to facilitate the progress thereof and shall cooperate with the Project Manager, Park District representatives, and any other contractors in every way possible. The Contractor shall thoroughly plan and coordinate all construction operations in order to expeditiously complete all work, so as to minimize disruption and inconvenience to the public's use of the facility.

47. Hours and Wages

Hours of work and rates of wages paid on this contract shall conform to all the provisions of either Section 4115 of the Ohio Revised Code or the Wage and Hour Division, United States Department of Labor. The wage rates to be paid to all employees working on the project shall not be less than those contained in the wage determinations found in Section 5 of the Contract Documents.

A certified copy of complete payrolls from the Contractor and each subcontractor for the work performed shall be submitted to the Park District. The certified payrolls shall include each employee's name, address, social security number, number of hours worked each day and the total each week, hourly rates of pay, job classification, fringe benefit payments, all deductions from wages and the dates when wages are to be issued.

Upon completion of the work and prior to final payment, the Contractor and all Subcontractors shall complete and submit completion affidavits to the Park District, which state that he has fully complied with Section 4115 of the Ohio Revised Code or the Wage and Hour Division, United States Department of Labor.

48. Non-Discrimination (EEO) Clause

The Contractor shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, creed, color, sex, national origin, ancestry, age, or disability as that term is defined in the Americans with Disabilities Act, military status (past, present, or future), or genetic information. The Contractor will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are hired and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, religion, creed, color, sex, national origin, ancestry, age, disability, military status, or genetic information. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: recruitment advertising; employment; promotion, demotion, or transfer; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the provisions of this non-discrimination clause. The Contractor shall require all of its subcontractors on the project to incorporate such non-discrimination requirements.

49. Payment

- a. The Contractor will make current "Applications for Payment" in writing, not more than one each month, and submit them to the Project Manager for approval. The request for payment shall cover the materials in place complete, and the amount of work performed in accordance with the contract during the preceding payment period and the value thereof. At the discretion of the Project Manager, allowances may be made for non-perishable materials which are to be incorporated into the work, when delivered and properly stored upon the site.

- b. For lump sum price contracts, the Contractor shall submit to the Park District, before the first Application for Payment, a schedule that apportions the lump sum price to the major components forming the work. This schedule shall be prepared in such form and supported by such data to substantiate its accuracy as the Park District may require, and shall be used only as a basis for the Contractor's applications for payment.
- c. Applications for payment shall be made at the rate of ninety-two percent (92%) of the total amount approved by the Park District as an estimated progress payment, less former payments thereon until the work is fifty percent (50%) completed; thereafter, all acceptable work in place shall be paid for at the rate of one hundred percent (100%) of each Park District approved estimate, less former payments thereon, provided that said work in place is free from any attested accounts, or from any claims for damages that might in any manner become a liability or charge against the Park District; and except as herein provided, the allowance of such estimates shall not be deemed final acceptance of the work or material therein included. Such progress payments will be made by the Park District upon reliance on the Contractor's sworn representation that any and all liens and encumbrances on the work have been fully discharged.
- d. From the date the contract is fifty percent (50%) complete, as evidenced by payments in the amount of at least fifty percent (50%) of the contract sum, all funds retained in order to ensure the faithful and proper performance of the contract will be deposited in an escrow account as designated in Section 153.63 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- e. The Park District will, within thirty (30) days after the receipt of the Contractor's Application for Payment, either pay the amount that the Park District determines is properly due, or notify the Contractor in writing of the reasons for withholding payment.
- f. No progress payment, nor any partial or entire use or occupancy of the project by the Park District, shall constitute an acceptance of any work not in accordance with the Contract Documents.
- g. The payment of the moneys provided for herein shall constitute a full and complete discharge of all the duties and obligations of the Mill Creek Metropolitan Park District under this contract, except those previously made in writing and identified by the Contractor as unsettled at the time of the Application for Payment.
- h. If the Contractor fails to comply with the terms of any of the Contract Documents, or with the orders or directions of the Park District as provided herein, the Park District reserves the right to withhold any payment or part of any payment that may be due until such terms, orders, or directions have been complied with to the satisfaction of the Park District. Payments may be withheld on account of: 1) defective work not remedied; 2) claims filed; 3) failure of the Contractor to make payments properly to subcontractors or for labor, material, or equipment; 4) damage to the Park District or another contractor; 5) failure to carry out the work in accordance with the Contract Documents; 6) failure of the Contractor to perform any of its obligations under the Contract Documents.
- i. The unit of measurement and basis of payment for all work performed under this contract shall be as called for in the Proposal. Payment will be made to the Contractor for actual Park District approved quantities of work performed, which quantities may be more or less than the quantities stated in the Proposal.
- j. Final payment to the Contractor shall not be made until Final Acceptance has been rendered by the Park District, and until the Contractor has delivered to the Park District all required documents as stated in the Contract Documents, including completion affidavits, certified payroll reports, waiver of liens, maintenance bond, as-built drawings, occupancy permits and certificates of inspections.
- k. Within thirty (30) days from Final Acceptance for the project and provided all required documents have been submitted, the Park District shall pay the Contractor the whole amount of the money then due the Contractor under the contract except such sums which have already been paid and except such sum as may have been expended by the Park District or may be due the Park District or properly deductible, under the provisions of the contract.

50. Pollution Protection, Restoration of Property

The Mill Creek Metropolitan Park District's mission is to preserve open space, to preserve natural features and to preserve plants and animals and their habitat. Consequently, any work performed in the Park District must be accomplished with the protection of the environment in mind. The Contractor shall be responsible for the preservation of all public and private property. No trees, shrubs, plants, wildlife or natural features are to be disturbed during construction without the prior written consent of the Executive Director of the Mill Creek Metropolitan Park District. Any material that falls into waterways shall be removed immediately.

The Contractor shall plan and execute all construction operations with necessary storm water controls to prevent erosion, sedimentation and water pollution. Contract related trash, debris, excess material, etc. shall not be burned on the project site. The Contractor shall provide positive means to prevent air-borne dust. The Contractor shall take proper precautions to prevent toxic or obtrusive odors from migrating into the atmosphere. All hazardous materials such as fuels, solvents, paints, etc. are to be handled in the approved manner so as not to cause pollution of the environment.

The Contractor shall be responsible for all damage or injury to property of any character during the prosecution of the work and said responsibility will not be released until the project shall have been completed and accepted.

When or where any direct or indirect damage or injury is done to public or private property by the Contractor, he shall restore, at his own expense, such property to a condition similar or equal to that existing before such damage or injury was done, by repairing, rebuilding or otherwise restoring as may be directed, or he shall make good such damage or injury in an acceptable manner.

51. Maintaining Clean Project Site

The Contractor shall maintain the project site free of waste materials, debris, and rubbish by removing all unused material, rubbish and debris from the site in a timely manner and disposing of same at Contractor's expense. Small debris and trash may be temporarily collected and stored in trash drums or dumpsters supplied by the Contractor. In no case shall Park District dumpsters or trash barrels be utilized by the Contractor for disposal of contract related trash and debris.

The Contractor shall use appropriate proactive methods in performing the work that prevent tracking of asphalt products, debris, mud, gravel, or other material upon streets or properties adjacent to the construction site by project vehicles. The Contractor shall be responsible to remove any material which has been deposited at the end of each working day, or before as directed by local authorities or the Project Manager.

Before Final Acceptance, the project site, including stream channels and banks within the work area and all waste areas, storage sites, haul roads and other ground occupied by the Contractor in connection with the work shall be cleaned of all rubbish, excess material, temporary structures, and equipment. Where deemed necessary by the Park District, these areas shall have suitable vegetative cover established by seeding and mulching in an approved manner at no additional cost to the Park District.

52. Termination for Convenience

The Board of Park Commissioners may terminate this contract at any time for its convenience when the circumstances existing at the time the agreement is entered into have changed to such an extent that the Board considers such termination to be in the best interest of the Park District. Any termination of this contract for alleged default that is ultimately held unjustified is automatically deemed a termination for the convenience of the Park District. The Contractor will be paid for all work satisfactorily completed up to the date of termination as determined by the Project Manager.

53. Unsatisfactory Progress and Termination of Contract

If the Contractor has not commenced his work within a reasonable time, or does not carry the same forward with reasonable progress, or is improperly performing the work, or has abandoned, or fails or refuses to complete this contract, the Executive Director of the Park District may so notify the Contractor in writing. The Executive Director may also order the Contractor to halt all further work on the project at this time. The Executive Director will then give written notice to the Board of Park Commissioners of his action. Upon the decision of the Board of Park Commissioners, the Contractor may be permitted to proceed with the work or the Executive Director may be directed to give written notice to the sureties on the bonds of the Contractor that the rights of the Contractor to control and supervise the work have been rescinded. If within ten (10) days after the receipt of such notice, such sureties on the contract performance bond or any one or more of them notify the Executive Director in writing of their intention to enter upon and complete the work covered by such contract, such sureties shall be permitted to do so and the Executive Director shall allow them thirty (30) days, after the receipt of such notice in writing, within which to enter upon the work and resume construction, unless such time is extended by the Executive Director for good cause shown. If such sureties do not carry the same forward with reasonable progress, or if they improperly perform, abandon, or fail to complete the work covered by any such contract, the Executive Director shall complete the same in the manner provided in this section. In the event the sureties on the contract performance bond, or any one or more of them, notify the Executive Director in writing of their intention to enter upon and complete the work, covered by such contract, and then fail or refuse to so complete, any additional costs reasonably incurred by the Executive Director as a result of such failure or refusal shall be computed by the Executive Director and become the liability of such surety, which is not limited by the amount of the contract performance bond. If the surety fails to pay such amount, the Executive Director shall certify the facts to the Park District's Legal Counsel, who shall proceed to collect such additional costs from the surety and the amount so collected shall be paid to the Park District to the credit of the fund from which the excess cost was originally paid.

If after receiving notice of the action of the Park District in terminating the control of the Contractor over the work covered by his contract, the sureties on such contract performance bond do not within ten (10) days give the Executive Director the written notice provided for in this section, the Executive Director shall cause that portion of the work which remains uncompleted to be re-estimated and re-advertised in accordance with the requirements applicable to original bids; or in the event the Executive Director determines with the approval of the Park District Board that an extraordinary emergency exists, he may contract for the completion of the work without advertising for bids, if he considers it to be in the best public interest.

Before entering into a contract for the completion of any such improvement, the Executive Director shall require a contract performance bond and a payment bond with sufficient sureties each in an amount equal to one hundred per cent (100%) of the estimated cost of completing the work, and conditions relating to the bonds of original contractors shall apply to such bonds.

If the cost of completing any such improvement exceeds the portion of the contract price remaining unpaid to the original contractor at the time of his default, such excess shall be computed by the Executive Director and becomes the liability of such contractor or surety or both. If either the Contractor or surety fails to pay such amount, the Executive Director shall certify the facts to the Park District Legal Counsel, who shall proceed to collect such excess cost from the Contractor and the sureties upon his contract performance bond, and the amount so collected shall be paid to the Park District to the credit of the fund from which the excess cost was originally paid.

Where the estimated cost of completing a defaulted contract does not exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000), or, if the Board of Commissioners declares an emergency, one hundred thousand dollars

(\$100,000), the Executive Director may complete the same by force account, or by a contract let without advertisement.

54. Substantial Completion

- a. Substantial Completion is the stage in the progress of the construction project when the work or designated portion thereof is sufficiently complete in accordance with the Contract Documents so that the Park District can occupy or utilize the construction project for its intended use, and all required occupancy permits, if any, have been issued. The project shall be deemed to be substantially complete when work on the project is completed in accordance with the Contract Documents except for minor "punch list" items which will not unreasonably interfere with the Park District's full use, occupancy and enjoyment of the construction project and provided that the Contractor has performed the contract in good faith and has not willfully deviated from the Contract Documents.
- b. The Park District's Project Manager shall determine at his or her sole discretion, the date of Substantial Completion for the project, and the decision of the Project Manager shall be binding on the Contractor, all subcontractors, all material suppliers and all employees. The Park District shall notify the Contractor in writing of the date of Substantial Completion.
- c. The Contractor shall use due-diligence to complete such minor "punch list" items so that Final Acceptance can be rendered within thirty (30) calendar days from the date of Substantial Completion. The Contractor shall cause the least possible interference with Park District facilities while completing these items.

55. Final Acceptance

The Park District shall determine finally, the satisfactory quality of the work, material and equipment furnished under the contract, and shall notify the Contractor of such in writing. This date of acceptance shall thusly begin the warranty period.

56. Warranty

If within one year from the date of final acceptance of the work (unless a machinery and/or material guarantee or a manufacturer's specification provides for an extended period of time) any materials or workmanship furnished hereunder may be discovered by the Park District on review and re-inspection to be defective, the Contractor, upon receipt of written notice from the Park District shall promptly replace or remedy any defects to the Park District's satisfaction and as described in the Contract Documents, without any cost to the Park District. This obligation shall survive termination of this contract.

57. Maintenance Bond

Upon Final Acceptance of the project by the Park District, the Contractor shall furnish a maintenance bond in a sum not less than ten percent (10%) of the total final contract amount. The bond must be from an approved surety company authorized to transact business within the State of Ohio. The premium on the bond shall be paid by the Contractor. The bond will not be released until the warranty period has expired and any materials or workmanship furnished under the contract that were discovered to be defective upon review and re-inspection by the Park District have been replaced or remedied by the Contractor, to the satisfaction of the Park District.

A participant may decide the method and frequency by which it determines the ineligibility of its principals. Each participant may, but is not required to, check the Nonprocurement List.
9. Nothing contained in the foregoing shall be construed to require establishment of a system of records in order to render in good faith the certification required by this clause. The knowledge and information of a participant is not required to exceed that which is normally possessed by a prudent person in the ordinary course of business dealings.
10. Except for transactions authorized under paragraph 6 of these instructions, if a participant in a covered transaction knowingly enters into a lower tier covered transaction with a person who is suspended, debarred, ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction, in addition to other remedies available to the Federal Government, the department or agency may terminate this transaction for cause or default.

Mill Creek MetroParks

Instructions to Contractors, Subcontractors, and Lessees Regarding Criminal Background Checks

The Policy adopted by the Board of Park Commissioners of Mill Creek MetroParks ("Park") in April, 2017, directs Contractors, Subcontractors, and Lessees (herein collectively, Company) of the Park to obtain criminal background checks on their personnel who will have direct contact with Park personnel and/or Park visitors so as to promote a safer and more secure environment of the Park.

Accordingly, each Company must submit to the Park, for each contract or lease between the Park and a Company, or between a Company and its subcontractor(s), the applicable completed Certification(s) which are attached to these instructions.

The following are answers to some frequently asked questions about this Policy and its process. If you have other questions, please contact Park Administration at (330)702-3000.

Some Questions and Answers

1. My company has been dealing with the Park for years with no problems. Why do I have to do anything different now?

Park policy has made changes for everyone who works with or around Park personnel and/or Park visitors. As an entity that contracts to work at the Park, you potentially have "covered persons" who may come into direct contact with Park personnel and/or Park visitors. These persons must now submit to criminal background checks before they can perform their duties on Park property. "Direct contact with Park personnel or Park Visitors" is considered to be unsupervised verbal or physical interaction with one or more Park personnel or Park visitors that is necessary for the performance of work. Direct contact can include irregular or chance contact, such as performing routine inspections or maintenance.

2. What convictions will mean that an employee is disqualified and prohibited from serving at the Park?

These are found on the certification form and include:

- Any Ohio felony offense convictions, which include all offenses against the person; these include, but are not limited to, criminal homicide, kidnapping, unlawful restraint, trafficking of persons, sexual offenses, assault offenses, and offenses that fall under any of these categories; or
- An offense that requires the individual to register as a sex offender under Ohio Law; or

COMPLETE AND RETURN WITH BID.

- Any equivalent offense under the laws of another state or federal government;

An employee with any such criminal background is prohibited from working at the Park in a capacity that will render them a covered person.

3. What if I review the information and cannot determine whether the employee has or has not been convicted of an act that would prohibit work at the Park?

The Park's Human Resources Department will assist you in reviewing the criminal background information if you are uncertain of whether a conviction qualifies as a prohibited conviction. The Park may also independently obtain the criminal background information of any of your employees, or one of your subcontractor's employees, who will be working at the Park if it deems the individual to be a covered person. Nevertheless, you must provide the certification to the Park prior to sending your employees to work at the Park.

4. I am a contractor/lessee who subcontracts some jobs or portions of jobs to complete my projects for the Park. These individuals are not really my employees, so do I have to conduct criminal background checks on them before sending them to the Park?

You must cause your subcontractor(s) to provide the same certification for its employees as you provide the Park for yours. Subcontractors who are individual persons and who otherwise meet the definition of a "covered person" must undergo a criminal background check. The definition of "covered" person is an individual who is employed or offered employment by an entity that contracts with the Park to provide work. "Covered person" includes the employees of a contractor, a lessee, or a subcontractor, as well as individuals who perform work for the Park. The bottom line is – if you intend to provide work for the Park, you and/or anyone who performs work for you at the Park and will have unsupervised "direct contact" with Park personnel or Park visitors is potentially considered a "covered person."

5. Going back to who is covered and who is not covered, my receptionist, who never leaves my main office that is 20 miles from the Park, will not have to undergo a criminal background check, but the workers who lay brick for my subcontractors at the Park will have to undergo a background check. How can I prevent or at least lessen by burden?

If the employee does not have unsupervised "direct contact" with Park personnel or Park visitors, he or she would fall outside of the definition of "covered person" and would not have to undergo a criminal background check. Therefore, if the work that you are providing does not otherwise require direct contact, ensuring that incidental unsupervised interaction does not occur, that would mean a criminal background check would not have to be conducted on those individuals. Some ideas that might assist you in making job assignments and/or ensuring that the opportunity for "direct contact" does not occur:

COMPLETE AND RETURN WITH BID.

- Provide a portable toilet at job sites solely to be used by your workers.
- Fence off any job sites.
- Plan work to be conducted when direct contact would be avoided.
- Draft rules for workers, and the subcontractors and their workers, that make clear the prohibitions against any unsupervised direct contact, regular or incidental.

This is not a comprehensive list. If you have ideas regarding how you can ensure that “direct contact” with Park personnel or Park visitors will not occur, we encourage you to share your ideas with us. Furthermore, if you determine that individuals are not “covered”, because precautions such as those listed above are put into place, you must ensure that the employees do not have direct contact with Park personnel or Park visitors.

6. What do I do with the criminal background information?

Complete the certification form included in this packet. The Park’s obligation with respect to contracting entities (contractor, subcontractor, or lessee) is to receive a certification from each contracting entity that all of the required criminal background checks have been conducted. This certification should be completed prior to the performance of any work under the contract or lease.

7. What if I am an independent contractor/lessee?

An independent contractor, subcontractor, or lessee who is not a separate legal entity, such as a corporation, partnership, limited liability company, or the like, must still comply with this policy.

8. Who is my contact at the Park?

Introduction: The Policy of Mill Creek MetroParks ("Park") requires Contractors, Subcontractors, and Lessees (herein collectively, "Company") of the Park to obtain criminal background information regarding covered employees and to certify that fact to the Park. Covered employees with disqualifying convictions are prohibited from working at the Park.

Definitions:

Covered employees: All employees of a Company who have or will have duties related to the work to be performed at the Park and have or may have unsupervised direct contact (verbal or physical interaction) with Park personnel and/or Park visitors. The Park will be the final arbiter of what constitutes direct contact.

Disqualifying conviction: One of the following offenses:

- Any Ohio felony offense conviction, which includes all offenses against a person. These include, but are not limited to criminal homicide, kidnapping and unlawful restraining; trafficking of persons; sexual offenses; assault offenses; and offenses that fall under any of these categories.
- An offense that requires the individual to register as a sex offender under Ohio Law;
or
- Any equivalent offense under the laws of another state or federal government;

the disqualified employee is not assigned to work at the Park for the duration of his or her employment with the Company.

(b) If company receives information that a covered employee has a disqualifying conviction, Company will immediately remove the covered employee from covered employee status, and promptly notify the Park verbally and then in writing within two (2) business days that it has done so.

- (3) Upon request, Company will make available for the Park's inspection the criminal background information of any covered employee. If the Park objects to the assignment of a covered employee on the basis of the covered employee's criminal background information, Company agrees to discontinue using that covered employee to provide work at the Park.

If Company is a Contractor utilizing Subcontractor(s) for work at the Park, the Company shall cause each such Subcontractor to complete and submit to the Park, and to abide by, a Criminal Background Check Certification utilizing the same certification form as this.

All related costs including background checks/fingerprinting shall be at the Company's expense.

Noncompliance by Company with this certification, or falsification of it, may be grounds for termination of Company's contract, subcontract, or lease.

That the Contractor and the Board of Park Commissioners, for the consideration hereinafter named, agree as follows:

ARTICLE I. SCOPE OF WORK

The Contractor shall furnish all labor, equipment and materials and perform all work set forth and described in the Contract Documents for:

2020 PARKING LOT IMPROVEMENTS

ARTICLE II. TIME OF COMPLETION OF WORK

The work to be performed under this Contract shall be completed in thirty-five (35) calendar days from the date stated in the "Notice to Proceed".

ARTICLE III. PAYMENT

The Board of Park Commissioners shall pay the Contractor for the performance of the Contract in current funds as provided in the Proposal and General Conditions of the Contract Documents.

ARTICLE IV. PREVAILING WAGE

The hours of work and rate of wages paid shall conform with all the provisions of the Ohio Revised Code Section 4115. A certified copy of complete payrolls from each contractor and sub-contractor for the work performed shall be filed with the Board of Park Commissioners.

Upon completion of the work and prior to final payment, the Contractor will file completion affidavits, as provided in the Contract Documents, with the Board of Park Commissioners stating that he has fully complied with the Revised Code Section 4115 requirements.

ARTICLE V. FINAL PAYMENT

No final payment shall be due until the Contractor submits to the Board of Park Commissioners the Completion Affidavit and Subcontractor Completion Affidavits and if necessary a supplement showing every unpaid employee and material supplier, with the amount due each, and a certificate of waiver from each material supplier. The Board of Park Commissioners will withhold from money then due the Contractor, the amounts due to the employees and material supplier shown on the statement of certificates so furnished as well as amounts shown on statements filed directly with the Board of Park Commissioners by employees and material suppliers.

ARTICLE VI. THE CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

The Contract Documents shall consist of the Agreement, Proposal, General Terms and Conditions, Plans & Specifications, Legal Advertisement, Prevailing Wage Rates, Construction Notes, the Completion Affidavits and Miscellaneous Attachments, and are as fully a part of the Contract as if herein repeated.

Prevailing Wage Threshold Levels

Before advertising for bids, contracting, or undertaking construction with its own forces, to construct a public improvement, the Public Authority shall have the Ohio Department of Commerce-Division of Industrial Compliance, Bureau of Wage and Hour Administration determine the prevailing rates of wages for workers employed on the public improvement. The wage determination must be included in the project specifications and printed on the bidding blanks where work is done by contract.

"New" construction threshold for <i>Building Construction</i>:	\$250,000
"Reconstruction, enlargement, alteration, repair, remodeling, renovation, or painting" threshold level for <i>Building Construction</i>:	\$75,000

As of January 1, 2020:

"New" construction that involves <i>roads, streets, alleys, sewers, ditches and other works connected to road or bridge construction</i> threshold level has been adjusted to:	\$93,292
"Reconstruction, enlargement, alteration, repair, remodeling, renovation, or painting" that involves <i>roads, streets, alleys, sewers, ditches and other works connected to road or bridge construction</i> threshold level has been adjusted to:	\$27,950

- A) Thresholds are to be adjusted biennially by the Director of the Ohio Department of Commerce.
- B) Biennial adjustments to threshold levels are made according to the Building Cost for Skilled Labor Index published by McGraw-Hill's Engineering News-Record, but may not increase or decrease more than 3% for any year.

Section 4115.05 provides, in part: "Where contracts are not awarded or construction undertaken within ninety days from the date of the establishment of the prevailing wages, there shall be a redetermination of the prevailing rate of wages before the contract is awarded." The expiration date of this wage schedule is listed above for your convenience only. This wage determination is not intended as a blanket determination to be used for all projects during this period without prior approval of this Department.

Section 4115.04, Ohio Revised Code provides, in part: "Such schedule of wages shall be attached to and made a part of the specifications for the work, and shall be printed on the bidding blanks where the work is done by contract..."

The contract between the letting authority and the successful bidder shall contain a statement requiring that mechanics and laborers be paid a prevailing rate of wage as required in Section 4115.06, Ohio Revised Code.

The contractor or subcontractor is required to file with the contracting public authority upon completion of the project and prior to final payment therefore an affidavit stating that he has fully complied with Chapter 4115 of the Ohio Revised Code.

The wage rates contained in this schedule are the "Prevailing Wages" as defined by Section 4115.03, Ohio Revised Code (the basic hourly rates plus certain fringe benefits). These rates and fringes shall be a minimum to be paid under a contract regulated by Chapter 4115 of the Ohio Revised Code by contractors and subcontractors. The prevailing wage rates contained in this schedule include the effective dates and wage rates currently on file. In cases where future effective dates are not included in this schedule, modifications to the wage schedule will be furnished to the Prevailing Wage Coordinator appointed by the public authority as soon as prevailing wage rates increases are received by this office.

"There shall be posted in a prominent and accessible place on the site of work a legible statement of the Schedule of Wage Rates specified in the contract to the various classifications of laborers, workmen, and mechanics employed, said statement to remain posted during the life of such contract." Section 4115.07, Ohio Revised Code.

Apprentices will be permitted to work only under a bona fide apprenticeship program if such program exists and if such program is registered with the Ohio Apprenticeship Council.

Section 4115.071 provides that no later than ten days before the first payment of wages is due to any employee of any contractor or subcontractor working on a contract regulated by Chapter 4115, Ohio Revised Code, the contracting public authority shall appoint one of his own employees to act as the prevailing wage coordinator for said contract. The duties of the prevailing wage coordinator are outlined in Section 4115.071 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4115.05 provides for an escalator in the prevailing wage rate. Each time a new rate is established, that rate is required to be paid on all ongoing public improvement projects.

A further requirement of Section 4115.05 of the Ohio Revised Code is: "On the occasion of the first pay date under a contract, the contractor shall furnish each employee not covered by a collective bargaining agreement or understanding between employers and bona fide organizations of Labor with individual written notification of the job classification to which the employee is assigned, the prevailing wage determined to be applicable to that classification, separated into the hourly rate of pay and the fringe payments, and the identity of the prevailing wage Coordinator appointed by the public authority. The contractor or subcontractor shall furnish the same notification to each affected employee every time the job classification of the employee is changed."

Work performed in connection with the installation of modular furniture may be subject to prevailing wage.

PREVAILING WAGE CONTRACTOR RESPONSIBILITIES

This is a summary of prevailing wage contractors' responsibilities. For more detailed information please refer to Chapter 4115 of the Ohio Revised Code

General Information

Ohio's prevailing wage laws apply to all public improvements financed in whole or in part by public funds when the total overall project cost is fairly estimated to be more than \$250,000 for new construction or \$75,000 for reconstruction, enlargement, alteration, repair, remodeling, renovation, or painting.

Ohio's prevailing wage laws apply to all public improvements financed in whole or in part by public funds when the total overall project cost is fairly estimated to be more than \$91,150 for new construction that involves roads, streets, alleys, sewers, ditches and other works connected to road or bridge construction or \$27,309 for reconstruction, enlargement, alteration, repair, remodeling, renovation, or painting of a public improvement that involves roads, streets, alleys, sewers, ditches and other works connected to road or bridge construction.

- a) Thresholds are to be adjusted biennially by the Administrator of Ohio Department of Commerce, Division of Industrial Compliance and Labor, Bureau of Wage and Hour Administration
- b) Biennial adjustments to threshold levels are made according to the Price Deflator for Construction Index, United States Department of Commerce, Bureau of the Census*, but may not increase or decrease more than 3% for any year

Penalties for violation

Violators are to be assessed the wages owed, plus a penalty of 100% of the wages owed.

Intentional Violations

If an intentional violation is determined to have occurred, the contractor is prohibited from contracting directly or indirectly with any public authority for the construction of a public improvement. Intentional violation means "a willful, knowing, or deliberate disregard for any provision" of the prevailing wage law and includes but is not limited to the following actions:

- Intentional failure to submit payroll reports as required, or knowingly submitting false or erroneous reports.
- Intentional misclassification of employees for the purpose of reducing wages.
- Intentional misclassification of employees as independent contractors or as apprentices.
- Intentional failure to pay the prevailing wage.
- Intentional failure to comply with the allowable ratio of apprentices to skilled workers as required by the regulations established by Ohio Department of Commerce, Division of Industrial Compliance and Labor, Bureau of Wage and Hour Administration.
- Intentionally employing an officer, of a contractor or subcontractor, that is known to be prohibited from contracting, directly or indirectly, with a public authority.

- G. Before employees start work on the project, supply them with written notification of their job classification, prevailing wage rate, fringe benefit amounts, and the name of the Prevailing Wage Coordinator for the project. A copy of the completed signed notification should be submitted to Prevailing Wage Coordinator.
- H. Supply all subcontractors with the Prevailing Wage Rates and changes.
- I. Submit certified payrolls within two (2) weeks after the initial pay period. Payrolls must include the following information:
 - 1. Employees' names, addresses, and social security numbers.
 - a. Corporate officers/owners/partners and any salaried personnel who do physical work on the project are considered employees. All rate and reporting requirements are applicable to these individuals.
 - 2. Employees' work classification.
 - a. Be specific about the laborers and/or operators (Group)
 - b. For all apprentices, show level/year and percent of journeyman's rate
 - 3. Hours worked on the project for each employee.
 - a. The number of hours worked in each day and the total number of hours worked each week.
 - 4. Hourly rate for each employee.
 - a. The minimum rate paid must be the wage rate for the appropriate classification. The Department's Wage Rate Schedule sets this rate.
 - b. All overtime worked is to be paid at time and one-half for all hours worked more than forty (40) per week.
 - 5. Where fringes are paid into a bona fide plan instead of cash, list each benefit and amount per hour paid to program for each employee.
 - a. When the amount contributed to the fringe benefit plan and the total number of hours worked by the employee on all projects for the year are documented, the hourly amount is calculated by dividing the total contribution of the employer by the total number of hours worked by the employee.
 - b. When the amount contributed to the fringe benefit is documented but not the total hours worked, the hourly amount is calculated by **dividing the total yearly contribution by 2080.**
 - 6. Gross amount earned on all projects during the pay period.
 - 7. Total deductions from employee's wages.
 - 8. Net amount paid.
- J. The reports shall be certified by the contractor, subcontractor, or duly appointed agent stating that the payroll is correct and complete; and that the wage rates shown are not less than those required by the O.R.C. 4115.
- K. Provide a Final Affidavit to the Prevailing Wage Coordinator upon the completion of the project.

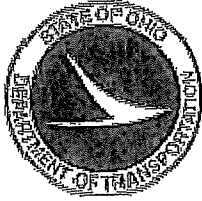

Section 6

Construction Notes

GENERAL

1.01 Project Description

This project is located at both the East Golf Hike & Bike Trail parking lot (West Golf Drive) and the Flats parking lot in Mill Creek Park, Boardman Township/City of Youngstown, Mahoning County, Ohio. This project consists of the installation of asphalt at the East Golf Hike & Bike Trail parking lot and the installation of a new entry drive and asphalt at the Flats parking lot. Items of construction consist of stripping and stockpiling topsoil, excavation, subgrade compaction, embankment, installation of aggregate courses, installation of asphalt courses, installation of a concrete walk, and miscellaneous related items of work.

The Contractor shall furnish all labor, materials, tools and equipment necessary for and incidental to the completion of all parts of the contract. The Contractor shall inform himself of the actual site conditions and with all the requirements of the Contract Documents, because the manner and quality of workmanship and materials shall conform to the Contract Documents in every respect.

1.03 Contract Term

The work shall be completed within thirty-five (35) calendar days. The contractor may choose a begin date at his earliest convenience, but must complete the project within thirty-five (35) calendar days of the chosen start date, with all work being completed by no later than October 1, 2020. The Contractor will be granted extensions to this contract term for days that weather limits performance of the work, as determined by the MetroParks. Once work begins, the Contractor shall expeditiously complete the work at the site without delay.

1.08 Drug-Free Workplace

The Contractor and all subcontractors for this project must be enrolled in the Ohio Bureau of Workers Compensation Drug-Free Workplace Program, or in a similar program approved by the Bureau of Workers Compensation. The Contractor shall be in good standing with the Bureau of Workers Compensation. Contractors that are not currently enrolled in a Drug-Free Workplace Program must enroll in such a program within ten (10) calendar days of the bid opening. Any contractor that does not meet this requirement will have their bid deemed non-responsive and cannot be awarded the contract. All Contractors submitting bids shall include documentation of current enrollment in a Drug-Free Workplace Program.

1.09 Utilities

The Contractor shall locate all aboveground and underground utility lines that are within the limits of the work, prior to beginning the work. Locations of utility lines shown on the plans may not be accurate, and additional lines may be present. All utility lines shall be protected from damage. Any damage caused by the Contractor shall be repaired to the satisfaction of the MetroParks at the Contractor's expense.

1.10 Field Office and Sanitary Facilities

No field office is required on this project. Public sanitary facilities for the East Golf Hike & Bike Trail parking lot are available at the MetroParks Golf Course and at nearby comfort stations. Public sanitary facilities for the Flats parking lot are available at Laternman's Mill but is approximately one-half mile away. All these facilities may be used by the Contractor.

1.11 Clean Project Site

The Contractor shall promptly and adequately clean up all spilled products from the project site. All contract related debris and trash shall be promptly removed from the construction site and disposed off-site at the Contractor's expense. All areas of the site shall be cleaned up in entirety upon completion of the project.

In the event of rain prior to proper drying of the surfacing, the Contractor shall take appropriate means to prevent any product from entering the storm drainage system.

1.12 Temporary Concrete Truck Washout Facilities

Washout of concrete mixer trucks shall be accomplished only in designated locations to eliminate the discharge of concrete waste material to the storm drain system, to natural watercourses or to natural park areas. Temporary concrete truck washout facilities shall be constructed and maintained on the project site,

consisting of a temporary pit or bermed area as shown in the details, in a sufficient quantity and size to completely contain all liquid and concrete waste generated during the washout operations.

Temporary concrete washout facilities shall be located a minimum of 50 feet from storm drain inlets, open drainage facilities and watercourses, as directed by the Project Manager. Each facility shall be located away from construction traffic or access areas to prevent disturbance or tracking. Washout facilities shall be marked with lath stakes and colored flagging. Washout facilities shall be maintained to provide adequate holding capacity and must be cleaned or new facilities constructed and ready for use once the washout facility is 75% full.

When temporary concrete washout facilities are no longer needed for the project, all hardened concrete, dry concrete slurry, residue and construction materials remaining from the washout location shall be removed and disposed off site. Holes, depressions or other ground disturbance caused by the removal of the temporary concrete washout facilities shall be backfilled and restored to a condition that existed prior to construction of the facility.

The Contractor shall be responsible to inform and educate all employees, subcontractors and suppliers of these requirements.

1.13 Use of Steel Made in the United States

Domestic steel use requirements as specified in Section 153.011 of the Ohio Revised Code apply to this project. All steel material used on this project shall be made in the United States pursuant to Sections 153.011 and 5525.21 of the Ohio Revised Code. Copies of Section 153.011 of the Revised Code can be obtained from the MetroParks Business Office or any of the offices of the State of Ohio, Department of Administrative Services.

1.14 Payment

- a. For payment directly from the MetroParks: Invoices shall be submitted by the Contractor to the MetroParks for review and approval. Approved invoices will be paid to the Contractor by the MetroParks.
- b. Within thirty (30) days after completion of all work, a detailed final invoice shall be prepared and submitted by the Contractor to the MetroParks.

1.15 Environmental Issues

- a. Protection of Park Property: Mill Creek MetroParks exists to preserve open space and natural areas. Consequently, work within the MetroParks must be done with protection of the environment in mind. No trees, shrubs, plants, wildlife or natural areas are to be disturbed during construction without the prior written consent of the Executive Director of the Mill Creek MetroParks. Any materials

that fall into waterways shall be removed immediately. All hazardous materials such as fuels, solvents, etc. are to be handled in the approved manner so as not to cause pollution of the environment.

- b. Mill Creek Park: Access to all Mill Creek MetroParks facilities shall be maintained at all times, except for the time needed to temporarily occupy the property. The duration of the temporary occupancy shall be less than the time needed to construction of the project.

Pedestrian and vehicular access shall be maintained at all times throughout construction activities using appropriate maintenance of traffic measures.

- c. Signage: Appropriate signage shall be installed by the contractor to alert users of Mill Creek Park construction activities, temporary access restrictions or closures, and direct users to secondary access points.
- d. Storage of Materials: The staging and/or storage of construction equipment or materials is permitted within the existing boundaries of the parking lot projects, and as approved by the MetroParks.
- e. Construction Coordination: The contractor shall be required to closely coordinate the construction schedule with Mill Creek MetroParks prior to the beginning of construction activities.

1.16 Record Retention

As Mill Creek MetroParks, the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) or the United States government may legitimately request from time to time, the Contractor agrees to make available for inspection and/or reproduction by the MetroParks, ODOT or the United States government, all records, books, and documents of every kind and description that relate to this contract.

1.17 Dispute Resolution Policy

PURPOSE:

This policy provides the Contractor and the MetroParks' Project Manager with administrative and procedural requirements for handling, processing and resolving disputes on MetroParks construction projects, so that uniform and fair methods are consistently used. The MetroParks is committed to prompt and fair resolution of all disputes of any nature which may arise on the project. Issues will be considered on a case by case basis and may involve confirmation by the MetroParks Board of Park Commissioners.

DEFINITION:

Dispute resolution is the process of satisfactorily resolving disagreements or disputes between parties.

PROCEDURES:

The Contractor shall promptly discuss any problems or concerns that are related to their work in any way with the MetroParks' Project Manager. If the Project Manager is the cause of the problem or if the Contractor feels uncomfortable

discussing the matter with the Project Manager, issues may be raised directly with the MetroParks' Director of Planning.

Whenever issues are raised, both the Contractor and the Project Manager shall make a good faith effort to resolve the matter by openly discussing the matter and attempting to reach a resolution. If resolution is not achieved, the issue will be referred to the Director of Planning who will conduct such investigation as deemed appropriate and will meet with the Contractor in a sincere effort to discuss, analyze and resolve the matter. If resolution is not achieved, the issue will be referred to the MetroParks' Executive Director who will conduct such investigation as deemed appropriate and will meet with the Contractor in a sincere effort to discuss, analyze and resolve the matter. The Executive Director may confer with the MetroParks' Board of Park Commissioners and/or legal counsel concerning the matter. The Executive Director shall issue a determination on the matter which shall be final and conclusive, unless the Contractor invokes mediation under this procedure.

If the Contractor is dissatisfied with the Executive Director's decision and the claim involves a material aspect of the contract or an allegation of violation of any law, the Contractor can request that the matter be submitted to mediation. The parties shall jointly designate a mediator, or if the parties cannot agree, the Contractor can request that a mediator be designated from any one of three or more certified mediation organizations located in the regional metropolitan area. The cost of the mediation shall be borne by the Contractor, unless the parties agree otherwise. The MetroParks and the Contractor are obligated to make a good faith effort to resolve the issue through mediation.

If the matter is not resolved in mediation, either the MetroParks or the Contractor may request that the matter be referred to arbitration by making a written request of the other party within sixty days of the conclusion of mediation. If the parties do not mutually designate an arbitrator, one will be selected under the rules and regulations of the American Arbitration Association for the arbitration of contract disputes. Upon the Contractor's request, an arbitration hearing will be held under the AAA Arbitration rules. The decision of the Arbitrator will be final and binding upon both parties. Judgment upon the arbitration award may be entered by any court having jurisdiction. The cost of the arbitration will be borne by the Contractor, unless otherwise directed by the arbitrator in the award.

1.18 Change Order Policy

Purpose:

This policy provides the Contractor and the Project Manager with administrative and procedural requirements for handling and processing contract modifications on MetroParks construction projects, so that uniform methods are consistently accomplished. In accordance with Section 2, Item 37 of the Contract Documents, the MetroParks, "without invalidating the Contract, may order extra work or make changes by altering, adding to, or deducting from the work, the contract sum being adjusted accordingly".

Definition:

Change Orders are written directives issued by the MetroParks to the Contractor, covering contract modifications in the plans and/or specifications and/or quantities, within or beyond the original scope of the contract. A Change Order clearly defines the modification(s), establishes the basis of payment by specifying if any increase or decrease to the contract amount is necessary, and addresses any necessary time adjustments to the contract term due to the contract modification(s).

Procedures:

- a. In accordance with Section 2, Item 37 of the Contract Documents, the Project Manager "shall have the authority to make minor changes in the work, not involving extra cost, but otherwise, except in an emergency endangering life or property, no extra work or change in the contract shall be made unless in pursuance of a written order to the Contractor from the MetroParks, and no claim for an addition to the contract sum shall be valid unless so ordered".
- b. The Contractor shall provide in writing to the Project Manager, a full description of the proposed modification and all associated issues. The Contractor shall include the following items:
 - Full description
 - Material and/or product information
 - Estimated quantities
 - Unit prices with extensions thereof showing total cost (prices shall include all costs associated with that item, such as delivery charges, equipment rental, fees, etc.)
 - Statement indicating the effect the proposed modification will have on the contract term
- c. Upon notification by the Contractor, and agreement by the Project Manager that a valid modification on the project needs to be considered, the Project Manager shall immediately notify the MetroParks Director of Planning. In consideration of all the information presented on the proposed change, the Director of Planning shall either authorize the Project Manager to proceed with the Change Order process, or based on the magnitude and cost considerations of the proposed change, the Director of Planning shall notify the MetroParks Executive Director for further discussion and subsequent determination.
- d. Any increase to the original contract amount must be discussed with the MetroParks Treasurer to verify that proper account balances are maintained. If the approved Change Order increases the original contract amount by more than ten percent (10%), a new request for Purchase Order must be prepared and processed through MetroParks bookkeeping for the additional amount.
- e. Unless such proposed alterations and increases or decreases materially change the character of the work to be performed or the cost thereof from the original bid proposal and items of construction, the altered work shall be paid for within the scope of the original items of construction and at the corresponding unit prices.
- f. If the Change Order is approved, the Project Manager shall subsequently prepare an official MetroParks Change Order form. The completed form shall be signed and dated by the Director of Planning or the Executive Director,

and the form shall then be submitted to the Contractor for signing. The original, fully executed copy of the Change Order shall be placed in the main project file at the MetroParks. Copies of the fully executed Change Order shall be mailed to the Contractor's surety company and surety agent by the MetroParks.

- g. Upon receipt of the fully executed Change Order, the Project Manager shall notify the Contractor to proceed with the proposed change as stated on the official Change Order.
- h. The approved work shall be performed in accordance with the plans and specifications, and as directed by the Project Manager. The work shall be paid for at the unit prices or lump sum prices stipulated in the official Change Order authorizing the work.
- i. The Project Manager shall properly document all Change Order work, including equipment, personnel, material and time required to accomplish the work.
- j. Upon determination by the MetroParks and acceptance by the Contractor of the final quantities on a project, a final Change Order shall be prepared and processed. The purpose of this Change Order is to adjust the contract amount based on the final approved quantities for the various items of construction, therefore establishing the final contract amount.

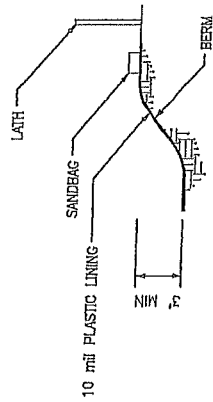

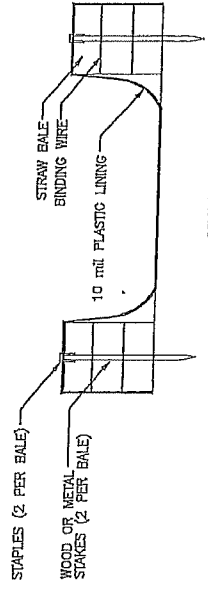

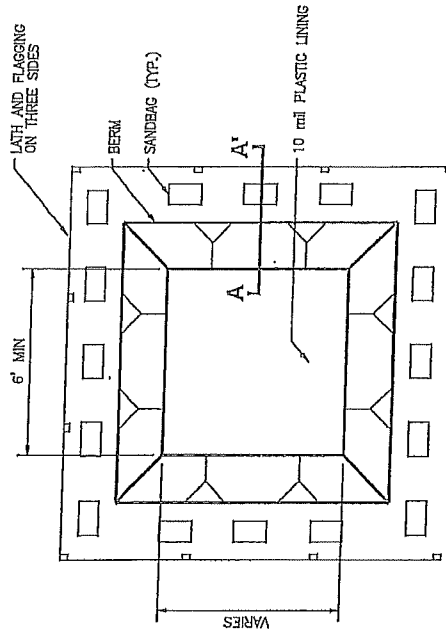
SECTION A-A'

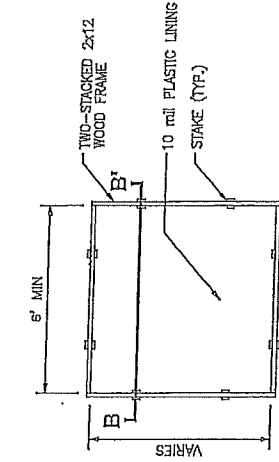

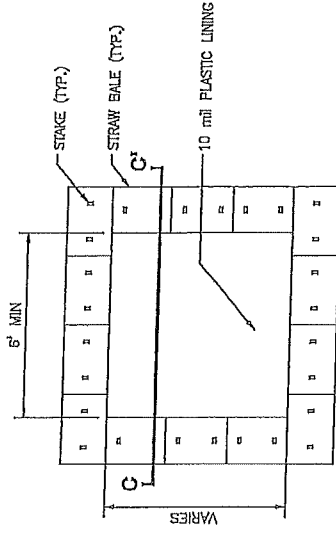
